School Ethos and Values

As a school, we chose the values that we considered to be important to us personally, and to our learning. These 5 values are: achievement, belief, creativity, determination and enthusiasm. These values now permeate every aspect of school life. Our aim is that if our 'Core Values' are entrenched in everything that we do, then the children at Uplands Manor will leave the school academically able, resilient, and have the learning skills necessary to be successful in their next stage of education.

E-Safety

E-Safety is explicitly taught though our rigorous Computing curriculum and is revisited each term. Children are taught key skills to enable them to use technology safely and what to do should they feel unsafe or uncomfortable. This is reinforced in other subjects and through key awareness days and assemblies. Our online safety policy states how monitoring of online safety is undertaken. Parents have access to key guidance through our website and E-Safety leaflet. Staff are kept up to date with changes in technology through regular CPD sessions.
