I have provided responses from school about how any actions are being addressed.

My child is happy at this school:

98% agree or don't know 2% disagree

School Response:

It is really pleasing that the vast majority of parents feel their child is happy at Uplands Manor. I encourage any parents who feel their child is not happy at school to raise this with their child's class teacher in the first instance so that we can do all we can to address any barriers or concerns.

Next term, we will be carrying out a pupil questionnaire to gather pupil voice on how the children feel about school.

My child feels safe at this school:

99% agree or don't know 1% disagree

School Response:

We work extremely hard to make sure that school is a safe place for the children. Thank you for this positive feedback. If you ever have concerns about safety at school, please come and speak with a senior member of staff so that we can look into and address your concerns.



My child makes good progress at this school:

98% agree or don't know <mark>2% disagree</mark>

School Response:

We are so proud of how hard the children work every day and are committed to helping every child to achieve to the very best of their potential. Over the past couple of years, we have focussed on helping the children to catch up and keep up with learning following COVID-19 lockdowns and disruption. We will continue to do this for any children who need it.

School Response:

We believe that providing children with quality teaching is vitally important, and as such invest a lot of time and money into training and developing our teaching staff. We now have consistent teaching and learning strategies used across school as well as a well planned and sequenced curriculum.

The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved

98% agree or don't know <mark>2% disagree</mark>

School Response:

Thank you for this feedback. Over the past few years, behaviour has significantly improved and we are proud that our children represent themselves so well. Low-level disruption in lessons is rare and any isolated behaviour incidents are dealt with proportionately and fairly.

If and when children do make mistakes, we put pastoral support in place to help them make better choices in the future.

This school deals effectively with bullying:

96% agree or don't know 4% disagree

School Response:

It is reassuring to see that the vast majority of parents feel that, when bullying occurs, we deal with it effectively.

We recognise that bullying can and does happen and continue to talk to the children about bullying through assemblies and RSE lessons. Whilst we only get very few cases every year, it is important that incidents are taken seriously and addressed properly to prevent them from happening again. We also make sure that the children know they have trusted adults in school who they can speak to if they have any worries or concerns.

We teach the children that bullying is if the same child or children are doing unkind things to them several times on purpose. We use the acronym 'STOP':

S everal

T imes

0n

P urpose

Please remember, not all unkind behaviour incidents are bullying. This does not mean that unkind actions by other children are in any way acceptable or will not be dealt with. It simply means that they are one-off incidents that will be addressed using our school's behaviour policy.

If there are any parents who do not feel that a bullying incident has been dealt with effectively or if you have any current concerns, I would welcome a conversation with you to discuss this further and to see if any further action needs to be taken.

We work hard to address any concerns raised with us as quickly as possible. It is reassuring to see that the vast majority of parents feel that we do this well.




Members of our pastoral and leadership teams are on the playground before and after school every day to talk with you if you have any messages or immediate concerns. Otherwise, our procedure when raising a complaint is:

- Speak to the class teacher
- If necessary, speak to the Year or Phase Lead for your child
- If unresolved, speak to a member of our senior team (Mrs Chester Inclusion and Pastoral Lead; Mr Flavell Curriculum Lead; Mrs Bennett Early Years Lead; Miss James Deputy Head Teacher; Mr Dickinson Head Teacher)

If any parents feel that a concern has not been addressed effectively, I would welcome a conversation with them to find out more and so learn from what has happened.

I receive valuable information from school about my child's progress:




School Response:
